Receptivity to Care

Most people are much more open to giving care than to receiving it. When a person is receiving care, he or she is acknowledging weakness, insecurity, and vulnerability. As a result, there are many people today who, though they could really benefit from a friend who would listen and care for them, instead tough it out on their own. They remain the strong, silent type, or wear a smile across a face that is holding back a flood of tears.

But God did not create us to be independent. Scripture stresses this theme with more than 50 verses that contain the words "one another." These verses don't say we alone are to love, encourage, build up, and pray for other people. The "one another" wording gives them a reciprocal meaning, telling us that we are also to allow other people to love, encourage, build up, and pray for us!

It can be most difficult for us to ask for help, but suffering alone is not God's intent for us.
