Session Highlights

The following are just some of the issues and topics that Session has been discussing over the past couple of meetings:

- ♦ We were happy to be informed that \$1400 had been raised for the McClains during our November Missions weekend and that they are now safely in Montana.
- ♦ After some discussion concerning problems with our sanctuary sound system, Session approved funds from the Contingency Fund to make the needed upgrades, many of which are being enjoyed right now.
- ♦ Session presented a slate of candidates to the congregation to fill our Pastor Search Committee. After being voted in, these individuals are now hard at work in the process of helping to find our new Head Pastor.
- ♦ We were pleased to find out during our December meeting that the church came pretty close to our 2107 budget calculations.
- Ochurch security has become a big issue, with potential terrorist attacks on unsuspecting congregations becoming an increasing possibility. To that end, a Church Security webinar was participated in by some Session members as well as others in the church. Some suggestions from that webinar have be implemented, with the possibility of other measures being introduced in the future. As always, the congregation's patience is asked for as these new procedures are put in place and "tweeked" to fit our particular building needs.

Revive and Survive

The church has received a free Automated External Defibrillator (AED) through the Franciscan Health Revive and Survive Program. An AED is designed to restart the heart in the event of a Sudden Cardiac Arrest, a main cause of cardiac deaths outside the hospital setting. FEPC's new Automated External Defibrillator (AED) has been installed in its cabinet on the wall outside the Music Room. Engineered to deliver a shock if needed in a Sudden Cardiac Arrest, it is available for use by our church AED Team, other trained providers, or even a willing member of the public. The AED is fully automated, meaning it talks you through the process of applying pads, evaluates the heart rhythm, and tells whether a shock is needed. We qualify to have another AED onsite if we send four more people to the free training session in Lafayette. If you have questions or are interested in being trained, contact Marty Rodkey.
