One of the ways that John the Apostle structured his gospel was to include 7 signs that pointed to Jesus' identity as the Messiah. John mentioned that Jesus did many other miracles, but he liked the symbolism of the number 7 (i.e. the 7 'I am' statements) and so that's what he included. These signs demonstrated aspects of Jesus' divine nature and power. These were John's way of presenting the 'evidence' that Jesus is who he claims to be, the Son of God. Join us next week as we take a look at Jesus' first sign, turning water to wine at a wedding in Cana. Kind of gives BYOW new meaning.
