THANKS FOR ALL your prayers and gifts! WE reached our goal of \$6800 - with \$22 extra!

And... thanks for prayerfully following Patty & I through these "unfamiliar places"! She (we) had a good monthly visit with her neurologist last Thursday. She was at her best when he saw her, but he would like for her to see a psychiatrist soon, "in case there's something he is missing". He cannot understand why this psychosis is lingering so long. ME TOO.

Patty's thinking is still a mix of irrational - rational, compulsive, fears and weird (sometimes inappropriate!) conclusions. Overall she is probably getting better.

My sister arrives this Friday for a week then Michelle (former EDGE-corp gal that was with us in Zambia for 2 years) will be here for 3 weeks. Several of Patty's friends and our caregiver will meet this Friday to discuss who will be with Patty the last 4-5 days after Michelle has left and before I return.

I leave next Tuesday (25 Sept) for Kenya, the new Africa Director Commissioning and Admin Forum in Nairobi for 14 African Countries - then connect with our (former) small group from church, a bunch of Nav staff then fly to Zambia to visit Chapo (new Nav Country Leader and friend since he was on University campus many years ago), Nelson Musipa, many others, the office there and attend Mutinta's wedding.

I will be back home on 24 Oct – so, I'll be gone for a month. Looking forward to connecting with friends there AND especially the ADMIN FORUM!! That has been planned for YEARS and we're finally having it! YEA!!! (OK... *THEY* are finally having it! I still FEEL like I live there!)

PLEASE PRAY for peace for Patty while I'm gone. She was VERY fearful and at times, paranoid today. "Highly anxious and confused. Unable to focus" for much of the afternoon.

PRAY for God to meet with the many administrators in Nairobi and affirm them of their doing HIS work around Africa!

Am excited about going to meet with the administrative leaders from 14 of the African nations where The Navigators have a ministry! I am "Going Home!" to Kenya and Zambia. YEA!

Much packing to do, several computers I'm carrying for friends, and other STUFF and 25 books and and ... Will meet this afternoon with "Caregiving Friends of Patty" To discuss some final details about Patty and "What-ifs", etc...

We are SO GRATEFUL for my sister and Michelle who are coming and Faye and friends, and hired caregivers here who will help!!!

And you! THANKS for making this possible for ME and PRAY that Patty accepts WHY she is here and not going THIS time. And grieves. And celebrates my going for both of us.

God's promise to Patty & me from *Ephesians 3:20* in 1981 that He would do exceeding abundantly BEYOND all we could ask or imagine.... Well - He has done and IS DOING THAT!! From, going in 1981 to ONE country (Kenya) to now going back to minister to the continent, while working with ALL the continents. God MUST have a sense of humor.
