November Update from Felipe Colby

In honor of me freaking out looking at tickets for our family to fly (from Honduras to the US January 6th and then back to Tegucigalpa on June 5th) and seeing that the cheapest price I can find for the four of us is \$6,580 total (anyone have some Skymiles they want to donate?)...our theme is US airline names.

We are going to keep this simple and go in the *Spirit* directly to prayer requests/items of note:

- 1. Continued prayers for our time on this *American* adventure. We are all doing very well, but definitely the pace of life with our different responsibilities and more travel makes for the possibility of relationship issues if we are not careful.
- 2. Hard to put this out there, but we as a family need more allegiant support. Donations to the mission that are designated for our family have been down quite a bit this year (50% down the first six months of the year) While we are here to raise awareness and find more partners for His Eyes, we are asking for prayer about more financial/spiritual individual partners for our family as well. If you are so moved, you can send a check to the address at the bottom of this email.
- 3. Prayers for a *united* group going to Tegucigalpa for a mission trip with our family in December. There are seven signed up at this point. There is still time to sign up, let us know!
- 4. Praying for the three points of the delta in the Milk Project (parents, children, staff.)
- 5. We need donated supplies for the container that will ship from FAME in Indianapolis down southwest to Tegucigalpa next spring. (ok...really just south) [Contact Amy Crawford for a list of what you can donate, or if you just want to donate some cash for us to purchase medicines and supplies.]
- 6. Forgetting politics and nationalities for moment, we want to take a moment to pray for the caravan of mostly Hondurans walking to the final *frontier*...to the land of opportunity.

We love you guys. God is using your prayers, your emails, phone calls, and time together to encourage us and keep us going. We thank you so much!
