## Stephen Ministry at FEPC



Caring Tip #1: Be gentle with yourself

The church's main winter holidays are just past. But grief does not take a holiday. We know this, but grief often hits harder at holiday time, perhaps because we expect all to be joyful, and then hope is dashed. Or maybe because now every year, the holiday will be linked to the memory of the loss. More than a few in our congregation have experienced loss of

family members in the days and weeks leading up to Christmas. Handling grief is not easy at any time of the year, and how you take care of yourself while mourning can help get you through. Being gentle with yourself means thinking about what you need and moving toward it. Perhaps you're physically exhausted. Then establish a nap time. In need of spiritual strengthening? Take time in scriptures that help you lament the loss and receive God's comfort. (See Psalms 6, 13, 22, 62, 139 and others.)

Emotionally drained? Spend time with a friend who will just listen, no matter how many times you need to recount what you've been through, or seek out a support group. (Ask a Stephen Minister.) While ultimately believers find their rest and hope in God alone (Psalm 62:5), there is much one can do to care well for oneself while on the path to His healing.
