

Caring Tip #9: Follow the Other Person's Need

Imagine this scenario. A friend's mother has just died at the age of 85. She had lived a full and vibrant life until five years ago, but then came a steady de-

cline. How do you respond? The book *Don't Sing Songs to a Heavy Heart* suggests: *Play it safe. Initially, simply express your sorrow. Follow the other person's lead from there on.* This means: Do a lot of listening. Avoid platitudes like "She lived a full life" or "She's better off." Let the hurting person state their conclusion instead of inserting yours. Simply hearing what's going on for them in that moment is enough. Letting the other take the lead is a way for you to show you value and prize that individual. Letting him or her lead is also an act of humility, an acknowledgement that you don't know it all. Your readiness to listen is a wonderful gift to a hurting person. Thankfully, God is always ready to listen to us, and He has provided Stephen Ministers at FEPC to come alongside and listen to the deep needs among the body. # Schedule Your Church Directory Photo Shoot(s)

It's time to sign up for your photo session. Lifetouch representatives will be here to take our church directory pictures Thursday—Saturday, October 10-12. Signing up for your photo session must be done online. If you are unable to sign up online, please contact Grayce Moore or Rae Jahn for assistance.

In addition to scheduling a session for your directory photo, **NEW** this year is an opportunity to schedule additional, generational photo sessions. If you want your extended family in a group photo, or if you want multiple family photos, you must schedule a separate photo session for each grouping. Examples: a grouping of you and all the grandchildren, a grouping of all your children and grandchildren, a separate grouping of each of your children and their children. These would require scheduling a separate photo session for each group picture. You can sign up for as many sessions as you want, in addition to the session for your church directory photo.

To schedule your photo session(s) go to **www.fepcfrankfort.org** Once there, select **Schedule Your Photo** to the right of the scrolling pictures. The Schedule Your Photo page includes a red link 1st-Presbyterian-Frankfort ... click that link. On the next screen click where it says "Click here to schedule your photography session". Then follow the steps on the screen. Once you have completed your schedule, you **must** create a login and password to save your schedule. When you are finished you will receive an email confirmation. It may sound complicated, but it really isn't. You can do it! And remember, if you run into trouble, contact Grayce Moore or Rae Jahn.
