Greetings Fellow Travelers!

MANY MANY thanks (asante and zikomo) to all of you for walking with us through this time in PRAYER and FINANCIAL SUPPORT!! WOW! Or, "SHANI" as we'd say in Zambia.

The Navigators have graciously allowed us to raise \$10,000 toward additional costs for Patty and receive it as salary. Already, we have received almost \$9000! Patty has been home for 5 days now and her thinking is a mix of rational thoughts, delusional thinking, compulsive behavior and hallucinations. She has spent most of today looking at copies of the same documents (old passports, school records, birth certificates, marriage license, etc) she has stared at for days. Not really making any "progress" with them – just looking at them.

Once again, I am not the "Real Bob". I think this means I'm "Bob number 6" now.

Yesterday we took a Kenyan couple to the airport who visited us for a week. The gift of their time with us WAS GREAT as we learned more about the impact of our investments in them over several years. Investing in people for His Kingdom is most encouraging when we have a GENERATIONAL PERSPECTIVE of His work!

Patty is now three weeks into a new med that should help her psychosis. Her neurologist says it may take SIX WEEKS to begin working. Meanwhile, I have arranged for a caregiver to be with Patty every weekday as I do the nighttime and weekend caregiving.

I found Psalms 88:8 this week – not encouraging, but accurate: "You have taken from me my closest friend(s) and have made me repulsive to her (them)."

Painfully true.

WE are so grateful for your walking with us along this daily "unfamiliar path" – Bob, ALL us "Bobs" for ALL of us.
