Caring Tip #10: Focus on the Other Person

Other-focused and unconditional love- agape love is what God has for us humans, and we struggle to follow Jesus' example and offer it to others. The struggle is

worthwhile, however. The more you can focus on the other person, the better friend, relative, neighbor, or work associate you will be to that suffering person. It is so easy to slip from other-focused to self-focused statements, as evidenced by my frequent default to "Well, I...", "When I...", or "My...". I could kick myself when I shift the spotlight to myself this way, rather than shining the soft light of love on the other person. Because we are human, we will not achieve the perfect, other-focused love that God embodies... but we can move closer to it. FEPC's Stephen Ministers have been trained to listen in a caring, non-judgmental way, and they are available to those in our congregation and community with deeper needs. Subject: Patty's in Memory Care...

Greetings Fellow Travelers -

MANY times, Patty and I clung to Isaiah 42: 16 -


I will lead the blind by ways they have not known, <u>along unfamiliar paths</u> I will guide them; I will turn the darkness into light before them and make the rough places smooth. These are the things I will do; I will not forsake them.

Yesterday we moved Patty into a Memory Care facility temporarily while her "thinker" returns. This "unfamiliar path" is hard. Somehow, not as hard as it was leaving Patty in the hospital in Nairobi for many weeks and driving home through Nairobi traffic late every night. Maybe because He has allowed me to do this several times. Maybe because the distance to the house is shorter. Maybe my heart has been down this dark 'path' many times already. Maybe I'm getting a bit used to "flying blind" along "unfamiliar paths". Maybe…?

Patty articulated many times that she wanted to be SAFE. Now, she is SAFE. In this Memory Care facility, they know how to help her and watch her and protect her and will also allow her freedom as she RE-COVERS. If that is where her brain is 'going'. Yesterday we eventually got her moved over there after a few logistical hiccups – but it WORKED! She asked me to go back to the house and bring her iPhone, iPad, Colorado ID, Passport, debit card, dress she planned to wear to the wedding and a few other things. Sounds legit. Except...

Her brain cannot use such items effectively since her desire for them is based on FEAR Her FEAR (firm belief) is that I am running away with someone else and will let 'her' use all Patty's things.

As one friend in Georgia so accurately summarized: "Patty's brain works SO well in the wrong direction, right?" Yes. CONSTANTLY. And yet, at moments she "connects" for seconds or a minute... Pray God gives her PEACE from all that she is trying to block out by constantly hiding, locking or unlocking the door.
