oppress us as we deal with isolation from loved ones, grief due to personal and community losses, strained finances, family tensions, the uncertainties of life as it continues to unfold, and more. Stephen Ministries in St. Louis offers this Prayer for People Suffering from Pandemic Fatigue:

Gracious Comforter, you come into the midst of our pain and lovingly dwell with us. During this pandemic, we ask that you strengthen and comfort those who are lonely, grieving, anxious, and overburdened. #### **Courtyard and Elevator Progress Continues ...**

The courtyard surface work is done. The next thing to happen is the roof over the elevator and the walkway. There is no firm date yet on when the elevator will arrive; but once it arrives, it will take 4-5 weeks to install.



#### WeCare Recovery

As many are aware, there is quite a growing problem with drugs and drug addiction in our community. Our church has recently partnered with a ministry called WeCare Recovery which was started by Frankfort's Bible Holiness Church in July of 2019. WeCare signed a lease with our Trustees to use the manse across from our church. This move increased the capacity of the ministry so that it can house 8, rather than 6 women. Additionally, FEPC's Mission Team opted to include WeCare in the 2021 Community Outreach budget.

WeCare is certified by the National Association of Recovery Residences and operates a nine-month, faith based program for women who are trying to turn their lives around and leave drug addiction behind. The women often come to the home directly after being incarcerated. They participate in addiction recovery classes, Bible study, life skills and financial planning classes. Many of the women attend church with staff members who work at the home.

The women pay a monthly fee to participate in the program and other funding is secured through a program called Recovery Works. Currently there are four staff members, one of whom is a Nurse Practitioner. WeCare is working alongside One80Recovery, a men's facility that is being constructed on 200 West in Frankfort. The two ministries hope to have a cooperating physician to assist members from both homes.

**How can we help?** There are many items the home needs, some are one time needs, while others will be ongoing. **Current needs** include twin and full size sheets and blankets, towels and washcloths, a small vacuum, brooms, a large dining room table, and a locking file cabinet. **Ongoing needs** are paper products (toilet paper, tissues, paper towels), cleaning supplies, trash bags, and office supplies. We will have a place set up at church on the stage where items can be contributed. Additionally, please continue to lift this wonderful ministry, its leaders and participants in your prayers.

Caleb reports that it was a wonderful success, with many people coming for the drive-by pick ups, and almost every table filled in Fellowship Hall. Donations exceeded what was expected and the extra funds will be used help Hope in the Harvest with new programs that are in need of support.

#### Update from Stan & Faith De La Cour

Serving Global Workers sent from SIM USA

From December 12 -19 we were guests of Shepherd's Care, a ministry to missionaries and other ministry people. They had arranged a home for us to stay in near the beach on Hilton Head Island, South Carolina. We enjoyed daily walks on the beach, miniature golf, meals that were provided, recreational reading and resting. Walking the beach one day, I realized that Bethany and her family were on the other side of that vast Atlantic as I faced north-east. One of the biggest disappointments of 2020 was having to give up an August vacation in the UK with that family. Talking with them the other day, our oldest grandson said he hoped we could visit them this August during their summer holiday.

Hope. Many of us have hope for the end of the pandemic, for harmony in our homes and in our country, for improved economic and financial security. May it be so in this new year. Yet the hope that can sustain us through all of this is the hope that comes from God, filling us with joy and peace as a result of our trust in Him. And the result of this is that we would overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. That is the kind of hope we are looking for this year.

This week we have two different groups of people at our Charlotte campus. The attendees are in training to prepare them to serve globally. Some will leave for overseas the following week. They all hope to use their abilities to the glory of God while sharing the good news of Jesus to a world that has yet to hear of Him.

Rejoice with us as several SIM USA missionary households who came back to the US earlier in 2020 are now preparing to return to their countries of service. Others are finally able to return to the US for a time of rest and renewal after having been involved in ministry while quarantined in their host countries. Some are wondering what their next assignments will be since they are unable to return to their previous place of ministry for various personal or political reasons. Each one needs prayer that they would be filled with joy and peace by our God of all hope during these transitions.

Over the last twelve months, we have been able to watch our gifted carpenters and craftsmen complete a 4-unit complex. Each two-bedroom apartment is available for SIM USA missionaries to stay for several months when in transition. One unit will be filled soon by a family that has moved every few months since returning from East Asia last February. We will walk with them as they hope in God to give them clarity for their next steps.

Other hopes we have for this year include being able to remain healthy. We want to be able to enjoy Anna's wedding in California this coming April. We hope that Bethany and her daughter can fly from the UK to join us at the wedding. And yes, we do hope that we can get to the UK to see the whole Bowden family later in the year. We hope that Stan's brother, Ed, responds well to chemotherapy. In all of these, we continue to ask God to fill us with joy and peace, even as we trust in God to guide and provide in His way.
