Myth #10: God should reveal His reasons for life's trials

For many, 2020 was a year of loss. It would take a very little time to make a very little time to make a very long list. Such lists of the common losses we as a nation have endured

are appearing in all manner of end-of-year writings. But many losses may be more private and difficult to acknowledge even to ourselves, much less speak of or put on a public list.

Loss inevitably brings pain, a state in which the heart and mind often seek answers. We want reasons. We want to make sense of what has happened and why God allowed it. We obsess and question even though we may know deep down that God does not owe us an answer, that He is God and we are not. Even Job, in all his troubles, did not receive an answer from God about why he was afflicted. Only God is sovereign, unlimited in knowledge and power, but He does give us His promises and His presence.

If you are having trouble getting through the questions of loss in your life or in this world, consider asking God, in His sovereignty and omnipotence, if a Stephen Minister (SM) could be helpful for you. Stephen Ministers are trained to be compassionate, Christ-centered, and confidential, and you can meet with your SM by phone, zoom, or carefully distanced in-person. To initiate a conversation about having a Stephen Minister, contact Pastor Kelly, Marty Rodkey, or Amanda Trent.
