Stephen Ministry at FEPC

Care-Givers or Cure-Givers?

It is not easy to observe, walk beside, or minister to someone who is suffering, as all caregivers know. Our FEPC Stephen Ministers (SMs) have served people in a variety of caregiving situations: a wife seeing her husband's ever-worsening health, parents caring for grown children in life challenges, children caring for elderly parents, and more. And in these Stephen Minister/Care Receiver matches, the SMs become caregivers as well. Recently, a Stephen Minister asked me to remind all caregivers of a key SM principle: *We are the Care-Givers, God is the Cure-Giver.*

When SMs remind each other of this truth, it does two things. First, it places one's trust securely on God, not on one's own efforts. That brings a sigh of relief, and sometimes tears, that it's not all up to the caregiver. Our part is to care; it is up to God to apply His cure. Second, it gives hope, knowing that whether or not our desires come to fruition, there can be an ultimate cure through the One who sees it all, knows it all, and loves each one in the caregiving situation. For we have...the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles... (2 Corinthians 1:3-4) to accompany and care for us on our caregiving journey.

Happy Summer! It has been busy already but in the best ways. I've been able to have time off from work and meeting with students since most people are gone for the summer and I am feeling so refreshed! That being said I do still have work this summer!

The majority of my working time is used to read lots of books for the study program and to start the process of summer fundraising again!

Last year the task of fundraising felt quite daunting and it really pushed me to be bold, challenged my trust in the Lord, and taught me how to communicate well what the Lord was calling me to do. It was such a joy to have conversations with so many of you and I loved being able to update you all each month about how things were going.

Even now, it still blows my mind that you helped me raise forty-eight thousand dollars. God was so evidently at work in that process and used so many people to come alongside me and support me financially and in prayer.

Down to the nitty-gritty

I am deeply grateful to everyone who prayed for me and financially supported me during the first year. Know that you have played a part in my life, the lives of students, and the Kingdom! Your support does not go unnoticed!


