

FEPC Elevator Ready for Use



Congratulations to Colleen Spencer and the Trustees for a job well done! It is so nice to say, "If your knees are acting up, don't struggle with the stairs — USE THE ELEVATOR! It's a smooth ride."

Dan Troyer was kind enough to post signage in the elevator to help you know which buttons to use to access the different floors. The arrows indicate which door will open for each floor. Thank you, Dan.



Some additional things you need to know about the panel when you are in the elevator:

Open and Close Buttons



The two buttons on the LEFT operate the door to the **Courtyard** when you reach **1**. The two buttons on the **RIGHT** operate the door on the other floors: **3**, **2**, **and B**.

The **top buttons** are used to **open** the doors when they are closing, or to hold the door open when it is kept pressed.

The **bottom buttons** are used to close the doors.



The **Alarm** (Bell) button will sound an alarm. This should be used only if the elevator gets stuck. Kelly suggests you use the phone button instead if you are stuck in the elevator.

The **Phone** button will place a call to a dispatch center and can be used to call for help if the elevator is stuck. The emergency will then be reported to the fire or police department. There is a speaker panel in the elevator that allows you to talk with the dispatcher.

The X is not a button, but a key switch to be used by elevator maintenance staff.
