<u>Milk Project</u>

Construction continues on the new Milk Project building in Cantarranas, and food was purchased to start with the 35 children in April! Our new ministry assistant Cecilia (some of you might have heard of her...bilingual, has volunteered off and on with the Milk Project for 20 years, last name COLBY) has been sending out the new childrens' profiles to sponsors, and sponsors have been helping in record numbers with special needs the families have (roofs, beds, cisterns, food).

<u>Acreage</u>

The farms are a continually developing side of the mission work. Coffee harvest finished up this month and already the coffee plants are in the ground straight from the nursery (thanks to IDES for providing bigger bags so the plants could grow bigger). We are still praying about hiring the farm-growth director.

<u>Groups</u>

March saw THREE different groups! We had two medical teams and a student team. A total of eight brigade days, Milk Project building painted in Las Botijas, and more!

<u>Infirmary</u>

The medical clinic is expanding with five new rooms because everything is bursting at the seams! The staff is also instrumental in helping the short term medical teams on medical brigade days.

<u>Colby</u>

We were in Honduras during March, we will be out and about in the USA in April, and then back in Honduras in May! If we haven't seen you lately, write us to see how we can rectify that.... if not in April, then perhaps in the fall!

Sanctuaries

Marvin, our milk project English teacher, will soon have a new position as church development director alongside Oscar. Looking forward to what he will do in this role and praying we can finish the office building soon for him to have space to work in...not just his office but also the meeting space for conferences, meetings, teaching times, etc. Also praying about what to do with the TV channel with the church in Talanga as it is struggling financially.
